Standards and Competencies Committee

The CHN Leadership Institute Subcommittee of the Standards and Competencies Standing Committee is undertaking a pilot leadership mentoring program to support CHN leadership development.

The program was launched through a well-attended Network Café at the CHNC Conference in which strong interest was demonstrated in the pilot.

Comprehensive planning for the program was informed by a review of the literature and existing successful mentorship programs focusing on leadership. The program encompasses several components that support its implementation including a Leadership Mentoring Program Guide and a Resource of leadership development opportunities.

The Program Guide includes two leadership frameworks: Leadership Competencies for Public Health and the LEADS framework which is based on capabilities. Mentors and mentees carry out a self-assessment to develop leadership skills and identify gaps using either leadership framework.

Two dyads (mentor/mentee) who established congruent goals are participating in the pilot. The pilot program is being evaluated.

Communications Committee

The Communications Standing Committee has an ambitious work plan for 2018 -19. We are focusing on website renewal – stay tuned for more information on work we will be doing designed to bring more for your membership buck as it relates to value from the CHNC website, forum discussion pages, and more.

Did you know?? The CCHN(C) certification is now offered twice yearly through the Canadian Nurses Association exam process.

Are you a CHN who wrote the CCHN(C) exam for the first time this fall, or are thinking about writing in the spring? Did you know you are eligible to apply for the Barbara Mildon Bursary of \$500 for nurses who successfully write the CCHN certification exam for the first-time? It's true!
