

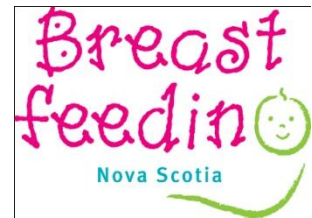

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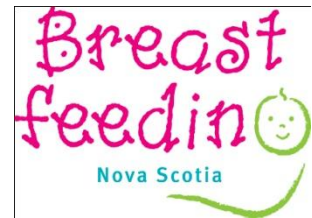


Goal

- Adaptation, implementation and evaluation



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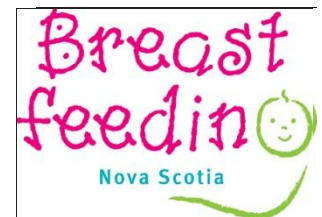
