Preferred Language

- Simultaneous interpretation for presentations and panel sessions
- Participants chose preferred language for group sessions
 - 70% English
 - 14% French
 - 16% Either





Evaluating Success

- Workshop objectives were met with a moderate to high degree of success:
 - 72.5% indicated that they would promote CHNAC in their organizations
 - 90% said that they had a better understanding of the Standards and their use
 - 76% had plans to increase their use of the Standards
 - Access to the workshop was maximized through translation, simultaneous interpretation and video taping
 - Plans are underway to form a CHNAC Atlantic Coalition





Lessons Learned

- Successful partnership with CPHA
- Consider including purchase of the toolkit in registration costs
- Simplify instructions for small group activities
- Have a CHNAC recruitment table
- Collect data that will capture manager's area of practice and community health centre staff
- Technology helpful in workshop planning
