#### **School Team Structure**



## Results from Stress Workshop Evaluations 2015/2016


- Over 90% of students indicated they know more about stress
- Over 90% of students indicated that they learned a new coping technique
- 100% of teachers were satisfied with the resources

- KHP- training our staff on multiple occasions










#### **Ready Set Create Contest**

#### **2015/2016 Evaluation Results**

- 87% of contest participants learned something new about their health topic
- Students working in teams identified increasing the following skills:

cooperation, communication& problem solving

  - Local Businesses







- 93% of students increased their knowledge on health topics
- 91% of students learned a new skill








## Results from our 2015/2016 Year End Survey with HS Champions

- 71% agreed there was an increase in student engagement
- 65% agreed there was in increase in student leadership
- 65% agreed there was in increase in student understanding of mental health and well-being
- 56% agreed there was in increase in staff
   understanding of mental health and well-being





#### **Lessons Learned**

- Need to be flexible
- Alignment of mandates and goals
- Having students involved is key (Student Voice)
- Support of Key champions in Schools
- Aware of trending topics/ resources/ focus areas
- Active partnership building, communication and sharing of resources
