
- Competency: knowledge, values & attitudes towards social media

IMPLICATIONS

- Room to increase knowledge and capacity for social media use
- Important to pay attention to specific platforms
- Opportunity to adopt more visual based social media tools
- Clarify, align and promote organizational policies and strategies

IMPLICATIONS

- Integrate social media into existing action on health equity: reporting, intervention, advocacy, engagement etc.
- Use social media to build relationships, access and use knowledge
- Evaluation needed (flexible and iterative)



ASSESS AND REPORT
Assess and report on a) the existence and impact of health inequities, and b) effective strategies to reduce these inequities.



PARTNER WITH OTHER SECTORS
Partner with other government and community organizations to identify ways to improve health outcomes for populations that experience marginalization.



INTERVENTIONS
Modify and orient interventions
and services to reduce inequities,
with an understanding of the
unique needs of populations that
experience marginalization.

MODIFY AND ORIENT



DEVELOPMENT
Lead, support and participate
with other organizations in policy
analysis and development, and in
advocacy for improvement in health
determinants and inequities.






Least popular social media tools

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
General comfort level and time spent on social media
